LCF Georgia Impact 2024





Advancing People's Democracy:

- **2,000** people participated in events to elevate our voice, stories, and contributions:
 - Latino Day at the Capitol
 - Farmworking Families at the Capitol
 - Orgullo (LGBTQ celebration)
 - Estamos Aquí Fiesta
- **200** individuals trained in advocacy and legislative processes
- Issued the "State of the Latino Community in Georgia Report" (stateoflatinosga.org)
- **2,275,858** people reached with digital civic participation campaign
- **11** billboards and **130** posters with civic participation information across South Georgia, Metro, and Hall Counties
- Every Latino voter touched three times through various bilingual field and digital tactics (**5,200+** doors knocked, **607,000** texts, **323,323** mailers, **199** community events) as part of the Latinos for Democracy nonpartisan coalition
- **30** polling locations across **7** counties covered with election protection efforts and volunteers supporting voters during the election.
- **21** bills tracked. A language access proposal through both chambers with full bipartisan support.

- **14** organizations part of "Latinos for Democracy" and Election Protection Coalitions
- **25** organizations part of Latino Day at the Capitol and Orgullo
- **46** volunteers engaged

Protecting and Building Communities:

- **12,283** FREE health screenings, supporting over **3,500** under insured or uninsured statewide
- **347** individuals with chronic conditions educated and referred to low-cost clinics
- **480** posters with health information and know your rights distributed in key businesses supported by
- **150** nonprofit, education, government, and business leaders participated in a briefing about the State of Latinos in Georgia as part of the Latino Summit
- **40** decision-makers (nonprofit leaders, law enforcement, policy makers) trained on requirements of "Georgia Criminal Alien Track and Report Act (HB 1105)"
- **39,834** individuals received public health information and education statewide through **8** consistent and recurrent locations for FREE screenings and **164** community workshops and events
- **12** community members certified by Emory as bilingual Community Health Workers
- Developed Public Health Surveillance System for data analysis and learning

Partnerships & Collaborations

- **33** organizations part of "Unidos Georgia" and health efforts statewide
- **8** consistent locations for screenings and health education: Consulate of Mexico, Consulate of El Salvador, Consulate of Guatemala, Consulate of Peru, The Latin American Association (The LAA), Tienda La Tarumara (South GA), Tienda La Rosa (South GA), Tienda La Jalisco (South GA)

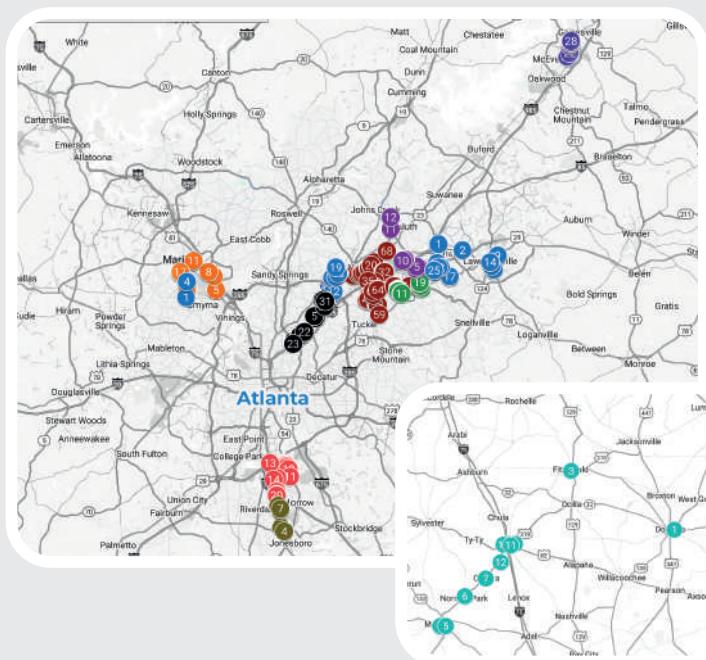


Expanding Economic Opportunity:

- **\$460,000** invested grants, scholarships, emergency assistance and food for community and member
- **1191** Families served with food essentials from the Welcoming Atlanta program
- **1004** Farmworkers received USDA relief payments of **\$600** each through our screening and outreach
- **250** families received emergency assistance and **17** families with direct financial support as part of our
- **65** students and entrepreneurs received direct scholarship or micro-grant support
- **18** member organizations received grants

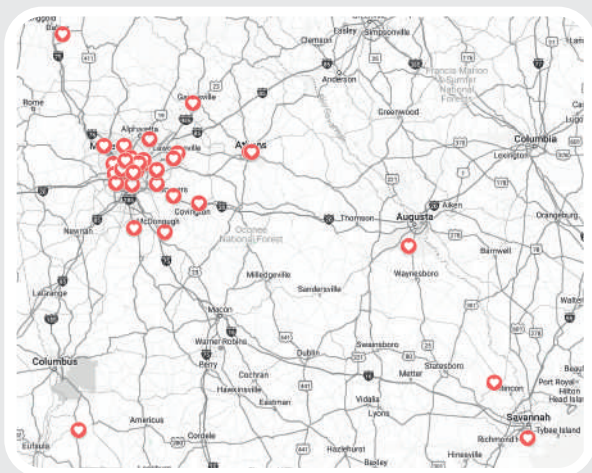
