

Immigrants in Georgia



- Immigrants are more likely to be working-age than their U.S.-born counterparts. This is true nationally and in Georgia.
- 89% of all undocumented immigrants are working age.
- 82% of Immigrants are 16-64 vs. 62% US born.
- 651,000 U.S.-born residents in the state are living with at least one immigrant parent.
- 124,000 businesses are owned by immigrant entrepreneurs
- 10% of the state population is foreign-born yet we are 16% of the workforce.
- 98.7% of Temp. Protected Status are working
- 96.5% of DACA eligible are working
- 95.5% of Refugees are working
- Depending on your immigration category you have different access to programs and benefits
- Undocumented people <u>and now</u> almost all lawfully present immigrants (except green card holders after 5 years with the status and citizens DO pay taxes but have NO ACCESS to benefits
- GA has some of the largest detention centers in the US

Latinos in Georgia

- 1,100,000+ Latinos in GA. 11% of the state
- 3 out of 5 Latinos are citizens, but most are under 21 years old
- 62% of the community is under 34 years old
- Latinos are more likely than any other demographic group to be employed
- 91% households report income yet 1 in 5 live in poverty
- 7.6% Latinos are self-employed. There are 91,-00+ Latin-owned businesses but 90% of them have revenues of \$200K or under
- 18% of the entire K-12 population is Latino
- Latinos are more likely to participate in early learning programs than any other demographic
- 77.6% of Latinos graduate high-school on time. This rate drops to 66% for English Learners. GA graduation rate is 87%
- GA has the 6th largest population of English Learners in the country.
- 52% of Latinos are housing burdened
- 1/3 of Latinos are undocumented or under documented. Most are parents of US citizens
