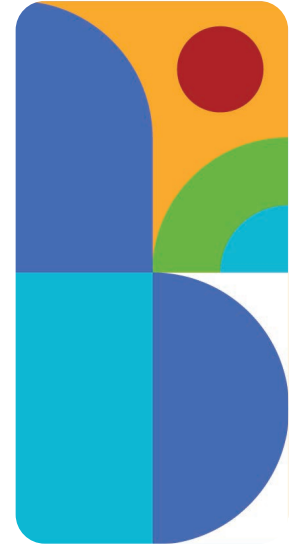


# LATINO COMMUNITY FUND GEORGIA

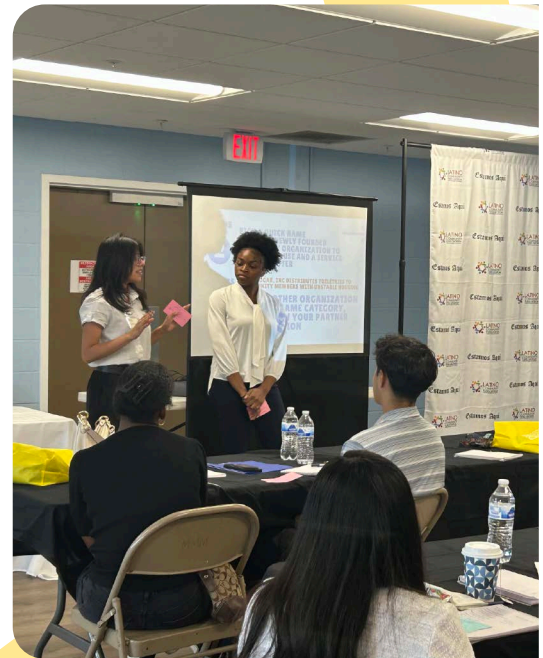
# Key Accomplishments & Services



## Advancing people's democracy

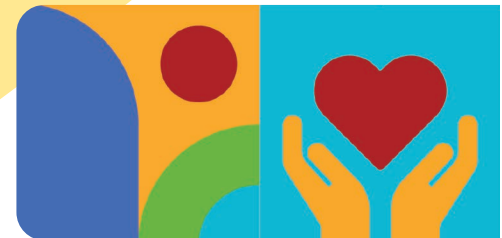
### Civic Participation & Advocacy Programs

- **Touched 323,000+ Latino voters twice** through canvassing, digital engagements, textbanking, phone banking, events & pop ups.
  - \* **20,700+ touched in person** through our **Latinos for Democracy Coalition**
  - \* **2,600+** volunteer hours from **373 volunteers**
- **30** polling locations supported by election protection volunteers
- **2,000** people came together through LCF Georgia hosted advocacy events
- **576** individuals trained in advocacy & legislative processes
- **21** bills tracked; Governor signed Language Access Bill (2025)
- **3** bills with full bipartisan support spearheaded by LCF Georgia



## Protecting & building Communities

### Health & Wellbeing / Crisis Response



- **13,823** FREE health screenings delivered statewide
- **21,891** individuals received public health education & know your rights
- **40 low-income** children supported by our 2gen soccer & wellbeing academy for a full month
- **352** individuals with chronic conditions referred to low-cost clinics

- **45** bilingual Community Health Workers certified by Emory
- **20 community workshops** covering nutrition, patient “Know Your Rights” (KYR), diabetes, hypertension, and mental health, plus **325 health screening** events statewide.
- **18** Civic Fellows trained; 5 community projects funded (\$10,000)
- **12 Sessions** for nonprofit leaders on digital and physical security, planning, compliance across topics, and **50 office** hours for grants readiness, planning, and strategy, benefiting **23 organizations**



## Expanding Economic Opportunity

Grantmaking · Scholarships · Entrepreneurship · Food Access

- **9,057** households served with food essentials alongside Welcoming Atlanta
- **51 grants to 38** organizations
- **47** students and entrepreneurs received direct scholarship or micro-grants
- First Immigrant-owned businesses needs assessment kicked off and in progress



# LEARNINGS & IMPACT

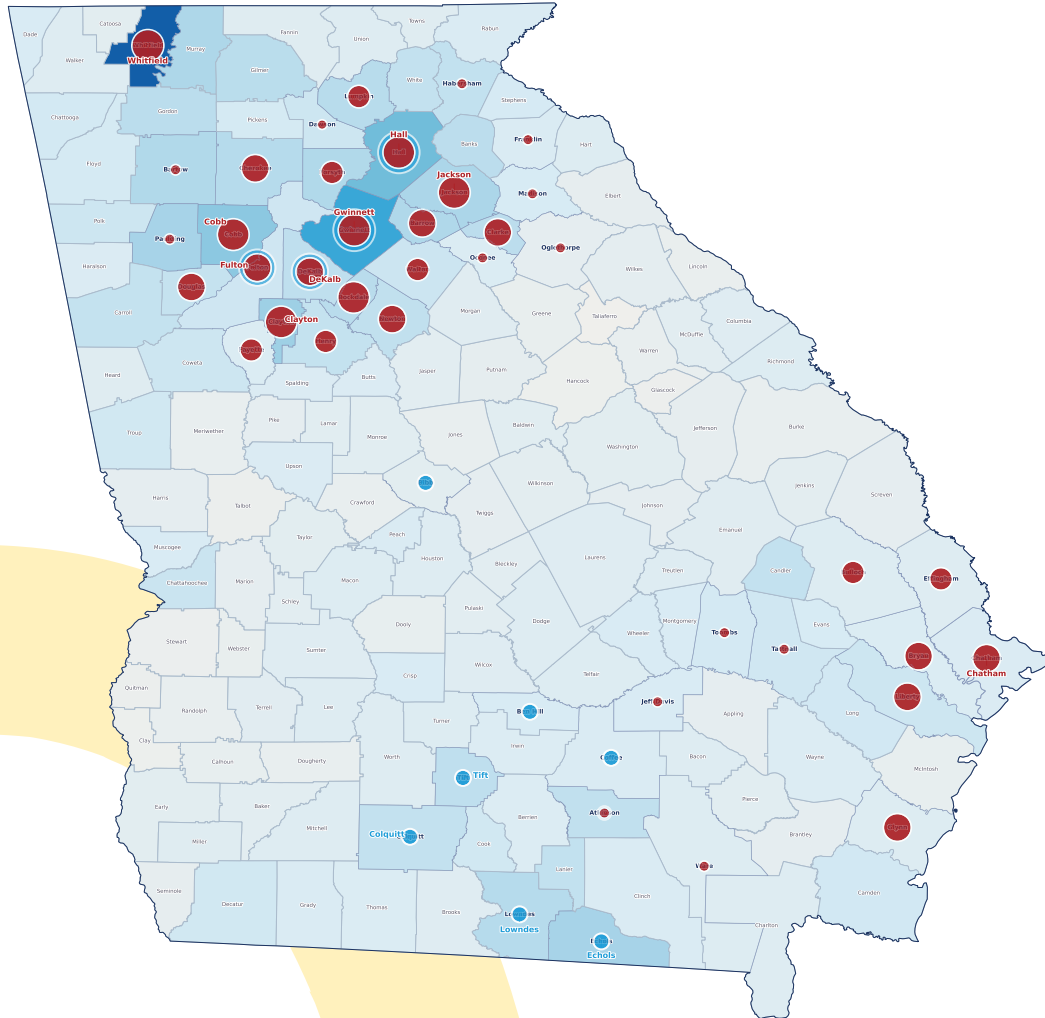


- **42.4%** scholarship recipients have both parents without a high school diploma
- **39.4% scholars** come from single-parent households; **26 engage** actively in extracurriculars
- **57%** entrepreneurship grants support single mothers; **92.9%** have dependents
- **With our grants, 5 organizations** launched multi-year strategic plans; 8 orgs strengthened daily operations
- **14 orgs** hosted Know-Your-Rights clinics + legal information sessions
- **250+** immigrant business owners received immigration-related information
- **Our grants** consistently funded emergency eviction relief, healthcare referrals, infant care & clothing
- **Civic Fellows** led projects in their communities aiming at menstrual health awareness + hygiene resources for young girls; flood Preparedness: STEM + career exploration + environmental education; and fire Safety: free smoke alarms + bilingual fire prevention for Latino families
- **25 funders** in Georgia joined briefings and engaged in ongoing learning on issues affecting Latino organizations and immigrants due to policy & regulatory changes

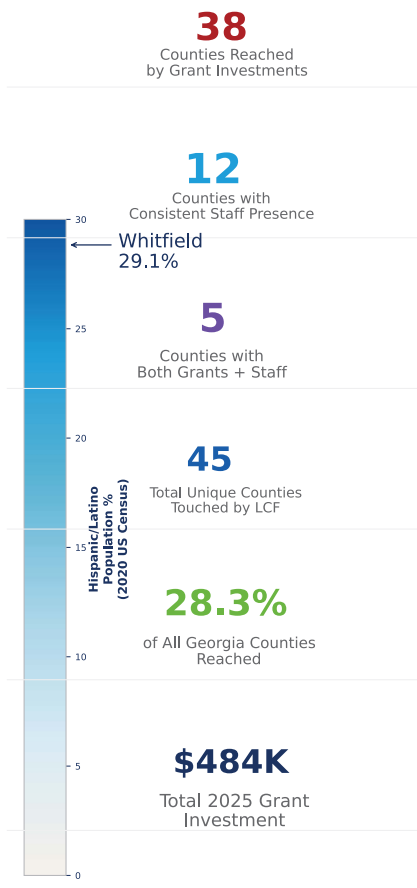
# LCF GEORGIA 2025 STATEWIDE IMPACT MAP

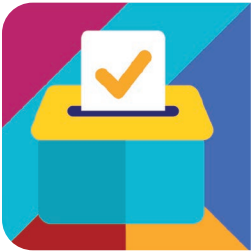

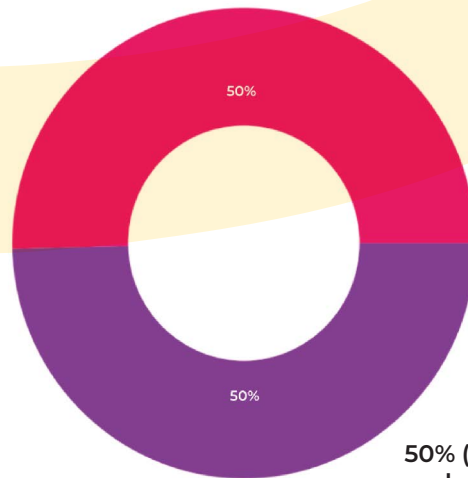

## Impact- First Financial Strategy

**89 cents out of every dollar goes directly back to the community through FREE programs, services and grants.** Our combined management and fundraising overhead of 11% affirms our commitment to maximize community impact by keeping a lean operational but efficient profile. Our mission-focused investments build direct community benefits and long-term opportunity expansion, including fair wages and benefits for our team doing the work with the community.

### Mission-Focused Spending: Impact vs. Infrastructure

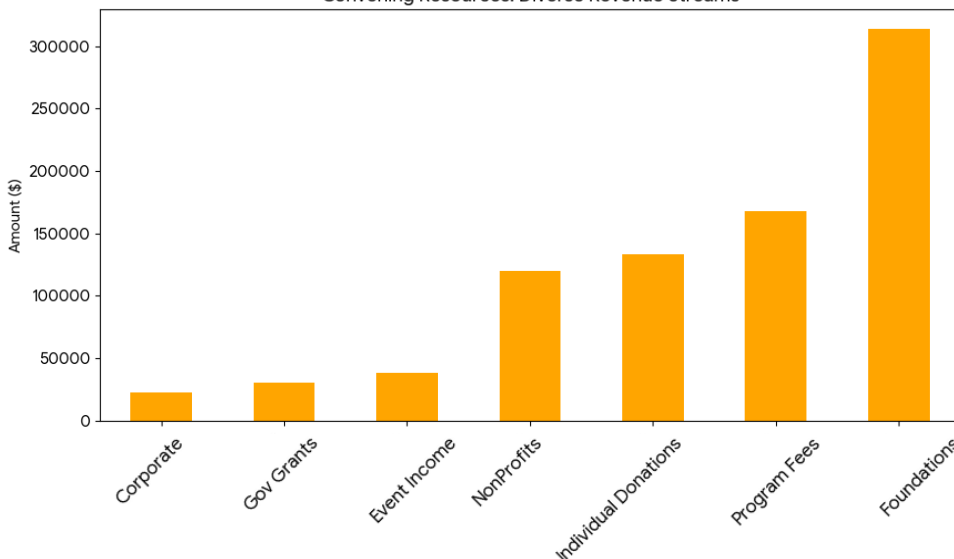
Direct Impact 50% (grants and direct program expenses)

Convening Resources: Diverse Revenue Streams



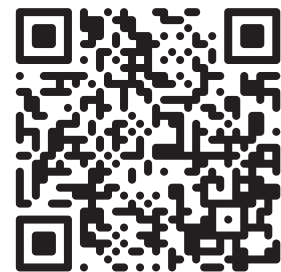
